HISTORY AND PHYSICAL EXAMINATION
DATE OF ADMISSION: 9-23-85

CHIEF COMPLAINT: This is a 13 year old white male who was admitted for violent behavior at home, apparently his mother was yelling at home alot for little things and he became upset and was misusing lighter fluid and according to the mother was going to burn her with lighter fluid. The father apparently is very passive, does not yell at her, according to the patient he should yell at the patient's mother more often. The patient denies hallucinations, delerium, grandiosity, problems at school, drinking, drug abuse, sleeping problems or nervousness. He feels relaxed at this time and has good temperature tolerance, actually prefers sunny hot weather and denies any signs suggestive of hyperthyroidism. He denies any other neurological symptoms of any kind and apparently has done some dangerous things in the past such as jumping off of a high altitude, but details are only available to the mother who is not here right now.

REVIEW OF SYSTEMS:

In General - No fever, chills, decreased exertional tolerance, questionable appetite imbalance.

Heent - No Heent or neck symptoms.

Respiratory and cardiovascular, gastrointestinal - No symptoms.

Extremities and neurological - Symptoms denied.

The patient denies any headaches, more specific blurred vision, double vision or hearing problems.

PAST MEDICAL HISTORY: Frequent strep throats, hospitalized for three strep throats in the past and denied any past psychiatric history, suicide ideations, suicide attempts, diabetes, high blood pressure or seizure disorder, heart problems, asthma, gout, or tuberculosis.

MEDICATIONS: The patient is on no medications.

It is found out that at age 10 he actually did have a suicide attempt and had assaultive behavior, especially to the past four to six months, from June to the present date. Does have one close friend and was not getting details on that situation at the time.

SOCIAL HISTORY: Is an only child living at home with mother and father. The mother is rather upset at times, easily upset and the father gets upset at things but hardly ever getting upset with people. The patient goes to school where he is doing fairlywell.

FAMILY HISTORY: Noncontributory.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

VITAL SIGNS: The patient's vital signs were stable with the blood pressure is 90 to 90 systolic range to 50 or 60 diastolic, afebrile, no acute distress.
